Year 1 ICT

Year 1 classroom were buzzing with Bee-Bots last week when Blossom from the Lambeth CLC came into school for some ICT workshops. All the children used floor robots called Bee-Bots to improve their skills in directional language and programming through sequences of forwards, backwards, left and right 90 degree turns.



The children worked enthusiastically in small groups to give instructions to the Bee-Bots to make them travel across a grid. By the end of the session the children were also able to write down their own instructions for Bee-Bot for others to programme in.



Moving toys workshop for Year 5

They made moving crocodile toys. The handle turns the cam, which then opens and closes the mouth of the crocodile.

Hampton Court Educational Visit



On Tuesday 4D visited Hampton Court Palace. Although it was originally built for Cardinal Thomas Wolsey, the palace was seized by the King, who extended the building and made it what it is today.



The children took part in a workshop about King Henry VIII and his six wives and the scandals that took place within the palace walls.

The workshop brought out the best in the children's acting skills and taught them a great deal about the kind of man King Henry was by re-enacting the timeline of events that led to him marrying each of his wives.



After the workshop we explored the palace grounds and saw just how grand a place it was and why it played such an important part in Tudor history.
