West Norwood Fire Crew Visit



On Monday Reception was visited by the West Norwood fire crew and had a fantastic time looking at the fire engine's firefighting equipment.



The children asked some fantastic questions and gained knowledge in how to use hoses and helmets and of course what to do in case of fire.



This week Reception classes have also been investigating distance and time in their maths sessions.

They used stopwatches to time running and climbing races.



Joel timed himself climbing the castle ("I'm going to see how fast I can climb the wall.")

The children made the most of the sunshine, designing paper planes and comparing how far they flew.

.....And the Horniman Museum

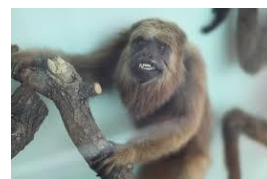


On Tuesday 4D went in search of animals as part of their topic at the Horniman museum.
